- CA-LIBRARIAN is a product of Computer Associates

Naming Conventions

In the description of installation procedures, all file names that contain the notation ISP_{nmn} refer to the current version of Natural ISPF, where nmn stands for version number, release level and SM level. For the current value of nmn , please see the label of the installation tape.

The section Natural ISPF Libraries of the Natural ISPF Administration Documentation contains a table that lists all Natural ISPF libraries as they appear after loading the installation tape, together with a descriptive name as to the library content. For example, a library named SYSISPX could be the Exit Library.
