

GLOBALS

Note:

This command applies to all platforms. If you are using remote development facilities, the GLOBALS command only affects the current environment.

GLOBALS [*parameter...*]

The GLOBALS command is used to set Natural session parameters.

The GLOBALS command corresponds to the SET GLOBALS statement. The parameters are the same as for the SET GLOBALS statement. The GLOBALS command and SET GLOBALS statement can both be used in the same Natural session. Parameter settings specified with a GLOBALS command remain in effect until they are overridden by a new GLOBALS command or SET GLOBALS statement, the session is terminated, or you log on to another library.

Parameter settings can be supplied in any order and must be separated by a blank. If more parameters are specified than will fit on one command line, several GLOBALS commands must be issued.

If the GLOBALS command is entered without parameters, a dialog box is displayed from which you can select parameter groupings and modify the settings.

The individual parameters are described in the section Session Parameters of the Natural Reference documentation.

Some parameter settings may be overridden during program execution using the LIMIT, EJECT, and FORMAT statements and by format entries specified in INPUT, DISPLAY, PRINT, and WRITE statements.
